

## WONDERLAND PLANS TO HELP COMBAT COVID-19 FOR THE 2021 CAMPING SEASON

---

Wonderland Camp has put into place a plan to decrease the exposure to COVID-19 and other communicable diseases to the extent possible based on the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the American Camping Association (ACA).

### Before arriving at Wonderland Camp

- We highly encourage campers and staff to be vaccinated against COVID-19 whether they have had the illness or not.
- Campers who have not been vaccinated and have been exposed to someone positive for COVID-19, exhibiting symptoms, or test positive themselves will not be able to attend camp for 14 days from the exposure, 10 days from exhibiting symptoms/positive test, and must be symptom free at arrival of camp. A full refund will be provided to campers who fit into this category.
- The parent or guardian of a camper will be expected to sign a waiver before their camper can attend camp that does not hold Wonderland Camp responsible should the camper become sick or injured.

### Health Screenings

- All campers will be screened and assessed upon arrival to Wonderland Camp by the nursing staff, including having their temperature checked. Campers that have a temperature of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or who are deemed at risk for having COVID-19 by the nursing staff, will not be permitted to stay at camp.
- Campers or staff that have a temperature of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher, or are symptomatic of COVID-19 will be brought immediately to the clinic and placed in the identified isolation room with its own en-suite bathroom until the parents/guardian can pick the camper up or the staff member can show a negative COVID-19 test.
- Campers and Staff that have received the COVID-19 vaccine will provide proof of vaccination before or upon arrival at Wonderland Camp. Vaccination is highly encouraged.
- Staff is expected to report any health concerns that they are experiencing and report to the clinic immediately if symptomatic.

### Hand Washing & Cleaning

- All staff and campers will be encouraged to practice proper hand hygiene. Sinks will be fully stocked with soap, paper towels, and trash cans. Hand sanitizer will be available throughout the camp and staff will carry hand sanitizer in their waist packs to provide to the campers and for self-use. Hand sanitizer – no touch- stations will be placed at the entrance of all common buildings.

- Additional cleaning staff have been hired for 2021 to clean and disinfect surfaces that are frequently handled using EPA-approved disinfectants. This includes door handles, sink handles, bathroom stalls, counters, and railings.

#### Dining

- Each meal will have two mealtimes to decrease the number of campers and staff in one area at the same time.
- Outdoor seating will also be available.
- Self-serve food and drink options will be avoided and sharing of food or drink will not be allowed.
- Staff will obtain camper trays and deliver them to the table, to avoid close contact serving lines.

#### Sleeping arrangements

- Camp bunk beds are currently 6 feet or more apart. There is a built-in cubby that acts as a partition from the next bunk.

#### Activities

- Weather permitting, most activities will be held outside. If the campers and staff are inside due to inclement weather or for other reasons, they will be separated in as many buildings as possible to decrease the number of people together in one place.
- Campers will be spread out when possible for activities.

#### Clinic

- Universal precautions will be used as expected.
- Clinic staff will wear proper PPE including masks, gowns, gloves, and eye shields if they are caring for someone who exhibits signs of COVID-19.

#### Masks

- A determination on mask wearing will be made closer to the opening of camp.
- We realize that many of our campers will not be able to maintain wearing masks for a long amount of time.
